



Code of Conduct

A community covenant for guests, groups, and staff

Jesus Camp Resort exists to be a place where families and ministries can come away from the noise and meet with God. This Code of Conduct describes the way we treat each other while we are on the property — rooted in love, marked by respect, and held together by grace.

"Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." — John 13:34

1 A Christ-Centered Community

Our mission is to host a faith-filled retreat that honors Jesus Christ. While you do not have to agree with every detail of our doctrine to stay here, we ask every guest to respect the Christian values, biblical principles, and spirit of worship that guide everything we do on this property.

2 Treat Every Person With Dignity

- Speak to and about others with kindness, patience, and respect.
- No demeaning, harassing, threatening, or discriminating language or behavior — ever.
- This includes interactions in person, on social media, and in shared spaces like dining halls and gathering rooms.
- Conflict happens. Bring it to a staff member so we can help resolve it peacefully.

3 Modesty & Dress

Modest, appropriate clothing is **required** in every common area of the property — cottages, dorms, dining halls, gathering spaces, the pool deck, the field, and everywhere in between. These standards apply to every guest, every age, and every season we are open.

Everyday Wear

- Tops must fully cover the chest, midriff, and back. No clothing that exposes cleavage or private areas.
- Bottoms must reach the knee or below. No short shorts, mini-skirts, or anything that rides up when seated.
- No clothing displaying profanity, offensive imagery, or messages contrary to Christian values.
- Dress for the activity — closed-toe shoes for the field, layers for evening services and prayer times.

Swimwear

There is plenty of modest swimwear available today, and we ask every guest to choose accordingly. The standard is simple: at the pool, on the deck, and walking to and from your room, you should remain **fully covered in the same areas everyday clothing covers**.

- **Women & girls:** swimwear must not reveal cleavage, the chest, the midriff, or any private area. Bottoms must extend to the knee. Swim dresses, swim skirts with leggings, tankinis with longer bottoms, and rash guards paired with swim shorts are all excellent options.
- **Men & boys:** the chest must remain covered at all times in the pool area — swim shirts, rash guards, or T-shirts are required. Swim trunks must be loose-fitting and reach the knee. No form-fitting or revealing swimwear of any kind.
- **Everyone:** always cover up when moving between cottages, dorms, dining areas, and the pool. A robe, T-shirt, swim cover-up, or wrap is required while traveling across the property.

These standards exist to protect the dignity of every guest and to keep the atmosphere of the camp respectful and Christ-honoring for everyone. Guests who arrive without compliant swimwear or clothing may be asked to change before joining group activities.

4 Respect Worship & Quiet Time

- When worship is taking place, please be respectful even if you are not participating.
- Phones, devices, and side conversations should be kept out of services and prayer times.
- Honor others who are seeking quiet space for reading, prayer, or rest.

5 Honesty & Integrity

- Be truthful in your bookings, registrations, and conversations.
- Do not take what isn't yours — including supplies, decorations, or food from kitchens.
- If you find lost property, bring it to the front desk.

6 Safety & Boundaries

- Physical fighting, threats, weapons, or destructive behavior result in immediate removal from the property.
- Adults may not be alone with unrelated minors in private spaces.
- Group leaders must enforce a two-adult rule for any youth activity.
- Report any safety concern to staff immediately — you are never being a bother by speaking up.

7 Care for the Property

- Leave every space cleaner than you found it.
- Treat cottages, dorms, gathering halls, and grounds as if they belonged to your family.
- Help us steward the camp well so it remains a blessing for the next group to come.

8 Group Leaders' Responsibility

If you are leading a group — retreat, ministry, youth weekend, or family reunion — you carry responsibility for the conduct of your people on the property. You agree to:

- Review this Code of Conduct with your group before arrival.
- Provide adequate adult supervision for minors.
- Be the first point of contact for issues within your group.
- Cooperate with JCR staff in keeping everyone safe.

9 Consequences

We hope we never have to enforce this section — but for clarity:

- **Minor issues:** a conversation with staff and a chance to correct course.
- **Repeated or serious issues:** removal from the property without refund, and potentially being asked not to return.
- **Anything illegal:** appropriate law enforcement will be contacted.
